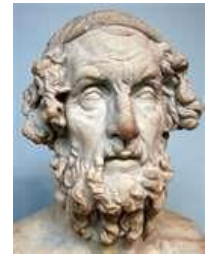


The Glory That Was Greece

1. Athenian playwright who wrote *Antigone*; explored what happens when an a person’s moral duty conflicts with the laws of the state
3. Athenian stonemason and philosopher that posed a series of questions to his students and challenged them to examine the implications of their answers
4. Wrote comedies like *Lysistrata*; sharply criticized society through ridicule, much like political cartoonists today
5. Epic writer; blind; most famous epics are *The Iliad* and *The Odyssey* (look on pg. 103-104 of textbook)
10. Athenian playwright who wrote *The Trojan Women*; his plays suggested that people, not the gods, were the cause of human misfortune
11. Philosopher that set up a school called the *Academy*, emphasized reason, and wrote *The Republic*
12. Wrote about the Peloponnesian War; lived through the war and vividly described the savagery of those involved
13. Athenian playwright who wrote a tragedy called *The Oresteia*; showed a powerful family torn apart by betrayal, murder, & revenge

14. Astronomer that showed the Earth was round and accurately calculated its circumference
15. Scientist that applied the principals of physics to make practical inventions; mastered the use of a lever and pulley

2. Mathematician that derived a formula ($a^2+b^2=c^2$) to calculate the relationship b/w the sides of a right triangle
6. Physician that studied the causes of illnesses & looked for cures; his oath set ethical standards for doctors (still take similar oath today); swore to “help the sick according to my ability and judgment but never with a view to injury & wrong
7. Plato’s student that analyzed all forms of government and found good and bad examples of each
8. Often called the “Father of History”; wrote *The Persian Wars*
9. Astronomer that argued the Earth rotated on its axis & orbited around the sun (heliocentric theory)
16. Wrote *The Elements* which became the basis for modern geometry
